**THE BASICS**

*Who:* written by Moses *When:* around 1406 BC. *Where:* the plains of Moab  
*Why:* "[Moses'] goal was to get the people [the second generation] to renew the covenant made at Sinai, that is, to make a fresh [unreserved] commitment to the Lord." –Anonymous

**LESSON THEME:** What is Moses' final desire for God's people?  
 To turn wanderers into overcomers!

- 3) Prepared to enter the land (3:12-4:43)


**God Has Loved And Cared For You**

Which reveal His expectations for your life

Toward Him

Toward your neighbor

Toward the world

His priorities for your choices

His blessings for your obedience

### God Has Given You His Promises

The obedient will be blessed *abundantly*

The disobedient will be disciplined

### Summary Of First Three Sermons

God has loved and cared for you (1:5-4:43)

He's been committed to your good and growth

In spite of your failures, He's remained faithful and gracious to you. Follow Him!

He's given you His Word (4:44-26:19)

His expectations, priorities and blessings

He's given you His promises of life and blessing for your obedience (27:1-30:30)

### And so God asks His people for ...

*A renewed and unreserved commitment to possess what He's promised to them*

### Moses' Fourth And Final Sermon

*Covenant Commitment*

1) Do not fear (31:1-27)

2) Exhortation to obedience (31:28-32:47)

3) Blessing of the people (32:48-33:29)

### Epilogue Of Deuteronomy

The leadership of the people is transferred to Joshua (34)

Moses dies at the age of 120

### What Has God Already Given Us?

He's loved and cared for us ever since He called us out of "Egypt"


His completed Word to guide and sustain us

His indwelling Spirit now, and a future with Him

The fruit of His Spirit

His Word, prayer, fellowship with other believers?


Do you need to recommit to holiness?



	DIVINE	MAIN ISSUES	HUMAN	
Ex 20:2-3 <b>1</b> Deut 5:6-7	God should be our first priority and final authority. We owe Him preference and obedience. Deut 6-11	<b>Authority</b>	Human authority must not sidetrack God's authority. Deut 16:18-18:22	Ex 20:12 <b>5</b> Deut 5:16
Ex 20:4-6 <b>2</b> Deut 5:8-10	Worship must reflect a proper view of God. It cannot be manipulative or self-serving. It cannot accommodate the world's standards. Deut 12	<b>Dignity</b>	The dignity of man must be preserved—involves his life, his family and his status. Deut 19:1-21:23 22:1-23:14 23:15-24:7	Ex 20:13-15 <b>6-7-8</b> Deut 5:17-19
Ex 20:7 <b>3</b> Deut 5:11	Must take our commitment to God seriously by remaining above reproach and avoiding anything that will lead us astray. Deut 13:1-14:21	<b>Commitment</b>	Must take our commitments to fellow man seriously. Deut 24:8-16	Ex 20:16 <b>9</b> Deut 5:20
Ex 20:8-11 <b>4</b> Deut 5:12-15	God has a right to our gratitude shown by dedicating things to Him; and a right to ask compassion in His name. Deut 14:22-16:17	<b>Rights &amp; Privileges</b>	Must understand the limits to our rights and must not violate the rights of others. Deut 24:17-26:15	Ex 20:17 <b>10</b> Deut 5:21
