PROVERBS 24:10-12; DANIEL 6

If you faint in the day of adversity, your strength is small. Rescue those who are being taken away to death; hold back those who are stumbling to the slaughter. If you say, "Behold, we did not know this," does not he who weighs the heart perceive it? Does not he who keeps watch over your soul know it, and will he not repay man according to his work?" Proverbs 24:10-12

1. Prayer is God's most powerful _____ against rebellious cultural initiatives.

When Daniel knew that the document had been signed, he went to his house where he had windows in his upper chamber open toward Jerusalem. He got down on his knees three times a day and prayed and gave thanks before his God, as he had done previously. Then these men came by agreement and found Daniel making petition and plea before his God. Daniel 6:10-11

2. Prayer might lead you to places where God can _____ display His power.

Then the king commanded, and Daniel was brought and cast into the den of lions. The king declared to Daniel, "May your God, whom you serve continually, deliver you!" Daniel 6:16

3. Prayer has the power to _____ people and policies that previously stood opposed to God.

"I make a decree, that in all my royal dominion people are to tremble and fear before the God of Daniel, for he is the living God, enduring forever; his kingdom shall never be destroyed, and his dominion shall be to the end. He delivers and rescues; he works signs and wonders in heaven and on earth, he who has saved Daniel from the power of the lions." Daniel 6:26-27

Standing up on our knees like Daniel

CONFESS any _____ or role you've played in the problem.

"... we have sinned and done wrong and acted wickedly and rebelled, turning aside from your commandments and rules." Daniel 9:5

ASK God to give people insight into His _____ truth.

"As it is written in the Law of Moses, all this calamity has come upon us; yet we have not entreated the favor of the Lord our God, turning from our iniquities and gaining insight by your truth." Daniel 9:13

PLEAD with God to give people the _____ to obey His law.

"... and have not obeyed the voice of the Lord our God by walking in his laws, which he set before us by his servants the prophets." Daniel 9:10

BEG God to have _____ on us as individuals and as a country.

"O my God, incline your ear and hear. Open your eyes and see our desolations, and the city that is called by your name. For we do not present our pleas before you because of our righteousness, but because of your great mercy." Daniel 9:18

Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. Resist him, firm in your faith ... 1 Peter 5:8-9a

HOME GROUP LESSON

1. Read Daniel chapter 6. At the time these events took place, Daniel was an elderly man living as a captive deported to a culture that was not his own. What about the way he faced cultural issues is particularly striking to you, considering his situation?

2. Very soon after Daniel asked God for help, God allowed Daniel to be put in the lion's den. Does this encourage or discourage you? Why? What does this tell you about the character of God and how He answers prayer?

3. In verse 10, Daniel "prayed and gave thanks before his God." Why is it important that the Scriptures specifically note that he gave thanks? What instruction does this provide you?

4. What "lions" do you fear when it comes to engaging in cultural issues?

5. As we mature in our faith, we develop a sense of how we should interact with cultural issues. How have you turned a blind eye to issues before, and how has the Holy Spirit shown you a different way?

6. Use the box at the bottom of the sermon notes as a template to pray for the issues that grip our culture.
