Sin came into the world through one person.


Death came into the world through sin.

II. The _____ is a free gift offered through one Man by one act. (vv. 15-21)

*Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men,
so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men. (v. 18)*

The free gift of life is available by grace to many through Jesus Christ.

This free gift counteracts the condemnation of sin and brings justification by faith.

Receivers of grace are imputed with Christ's righteousness to reign in this life and life forever.

HOME GROUP LESSON

1. Without looking at the sermon notes, briefly describe how death came into the world. Do you agree with this? Why or why not? Does our culture agree?

3. How did you come to know that you identified with the first Adam, even though you weren't there to commit his sin yourself? When someone claims they couldn't inherit sin that Adam committed, how would you explain the truth to them?

4. Name some ways you used to think or act when you were still under the influence of the first Adam. How were those things different after identifying with the last Adam, Jesus Christ?

5. How do you see man's character and God's character demonstrated in the three imputations the pastor talked about in the sermon?

6. Read aloud Luke 23:18-25 and John chapter 9. How is the moral state of *guilt* as described here different from a feeling of *shame*? Is a person still guilty of sin whether they feel shame or not? In trusting Christ for salvation, how does being free from both guilt *and* shame affect your everyday life? What will you do with that knowledge?
