Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. Romans 5:9




#2 OLD MAN, NEW MAN ROMANS 5:12-21

... so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men. Romans 5:18




#3 NEW LIFE FOR MAN ROMANS 6:1-23

For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free ... from the law of sin and death. Romans 8:2




#5 EVERYTHING NEW ROMANS 8:12-27
