Marked for Glory From Birth

MARK 8:11; MATTHEW 1:18-25

The Pharisees came and began to argue with him, seeking from him a sign from heaven to test him. Mark 8:11

I. Jesus was marked for glory from the beginning of His life: His virgin birth.

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Matthew 1:18
