THE THEOLOGY OF WORK

1. Work is neither a curse nor a graveyard, but a 9-to-5 garden in which we have a coworker.

The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to work it and keep it. Genesis 2:15

2. God has designed the world so that by our labor we meet our needs. (Prov 19:15. 28:19; 2 Thes 3:7-13)

For even when we were with you, we would give you this command: If anyone is not willing to work, let him not eat. 2 Thessalonians 3:10

3. At the end of the day our work should be for the Father, not for men.

Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. Colossians 3:23-24

4. God desires that we see our occupation through a spiritual lens as a platform to change our world. (Matt 6:28-34)

"Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' ... But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." Matthew 6:31-33

HOME GROUP LESSON

"I believe we need to cultivate a hopeful realism if we are going to thrive in our work. Your mind may be filled with idealistic phantoms of the perfect dream job. You may be encountering great difficulties in your work. But how are you approaching your work? Are you viewing your work through an idealistic or a realistic lens? A perfect job or career is not only unrealistic, it is theologically untenable. Even if you are blessed to have your dream job, I can assure you it will be hard and it will not be all you long for it to be. Whatever work we have been called to do will be a mixture of both the good and the not so good. We must recognize that at this point in redemptive history, our work will not be all we want it to be. However, the good news of the gospel is that the tragedy of humankind's fall into sin is not the end of the story. Though your work may be difficult and demanding, you can approach your work with a sense of hope and excitement that God can and will do remarkable things in and through the work he has called you to do. The writer of Ecclesiastes describes his disillusionment with work in a fallen world as futile and striving after wind. Clearly the biblical writer is deeply disillusioned with his life and work, but he also offers a ray of hope seeing his work as a gift from God. Work is both a curse and a gift. Our work gives evidence of our glorious creation as well as our great estrangement from God and our need for a Savior who will redeem us from sin's devastating curse."

DR. TOM NELSON, *WORK MATTERS*

What has a man from all the toil and striving of heart with which he toils beneath the sun? For all his days are full of sorrow, and his work is a vexation. Even in the night his heart does not rest. ... What gain has the worker from his toil? I have seen the business that God has given to the children of man to be busy with. He has made everything beautiful in its time. Also, he has put eternity into man's heart, yet so that he cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end. I perceived that there is nothing better for them than to be joyful and to do good as long as they live; also that everyone should eat and drink and take pleasure in all his toil—this is God's gift to man.

6. How have you seen the effects of the Fall in your work, whether it be full- or part-time employment, running a household, raising children, or being a student? What encouragement did you find in the sermon and in the quote above?
