MARK 9:2-8

I. Jesus draws His disciples away from distractions to speak to their concerns.

And after six days Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. v. 2a

II. Jesus reveals His transcendent power that will see His plan through.

And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became radiant, intensely white, as no one on earth could bleach them. And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, and they were talking with Jesus. vv. 2b-4

And a cloud overshadowed them, and a voice came out of the cloud, "This is my beloved Son; listen to him." And suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone with them but Jesus only. vv. 5-8

To get a Glimpse of Glory ...

For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. For when he received honor and glory from God the Father, and the voice was borne to him by the Majestic Glory, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased," we ourselves heard this very voice borne from heaven, for we were with him on the holy mountain. 2 Peter 1:16-18

HOME GROUP LESSON

"For those of us, like Peter, who have come to trust in Jesus as the Savior, the application is that we must listen to Him by reading His word. God has spoken finally and fully in the person of His Son.

Let us listen to what our Lord says to us in His Word. There are many 'Christian' works available to us today, and unfortunately they are often not written or used to enhance our study of the Bible, but to replace it. Many Christians mistakenly suppose that listening to a preacher is listening to God's Word. Not so! God has gifted men to teach His Word, but that is to enhance our understanding of the Word, not to replace our own study. God will hold us responsible for what we believe, not for what others have taught us. I have attended many Bible studies where the mood, if not the stated emphasis, went something like this: *'Well, this is what this passage means to me ...'* Frankly, most of us haven't studied the text enough to have any opinion as to its meaning. Without knowing it, our words are like Peter's—we don't know what we are saying. The important thing is to learn what the text means, and then to ask ourselves what we are going to do about it. We often 'listen' to God's Word the same way that Peter did.

We listen to the parts we like (i.e. the crown) and we reject the parts we dislike (i.e. the cross). We do not have this option. That is what the transfiguration was saying to Peter. The crown and the cross must be believed and practiced together. How often when we do read the Word, we read it selectively, taking its promises, its hope, its comfort, but ignoring or setting aside its rebuke. The Words of the Father should be ringing in our ears: Since Jesus is the King, we had better to listen to what He says—*ALL* of what He says."

HEBREWS 1:1-3a

1. Read Mark 9:2-8 and Matthew 17:1-13. What expectations do you have of God that you feel are not being met right now? How have these passages of Scripture given you a new perspective?
2. How does this scene give us glimpses of life after death, and how does it encourage you?
3. Read Mark 8:27-38. What things did Peter experience just prior to seeing Jesus transfigured on the mountain, and how do you think these events affected the way he saw himself and Jesus? How do Peter's reactions remind you of your own?
4. Is Jesus just one voice among many in your life? What other voices do you tend to entertain (e.g., feelings, family, past experiences, circumstances) as much as His?
5. What percent of the time do you read books or listen to speakers rather than studying God's Word for yourself? How often do you find that you can recite what others say about the Scriptures more than reciting Scripture itself? Does a change need to be made?
6. Read 2 Peter 1:16-18. Christ is our only hope when circumstances bring confusion, disappointment and bewilderment. How will you exalt Him above all else? How will you step out in obedience?
