**The Key to “the Blessing”**  
**PSALM 133**

**I. A POINT: God’s vision for His world is \_\_\_\_\_ in your world.**

v. 1 *Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity!*

**II. TWO PICTURES:**

A. “Like” oil: **Godly unity is like a \_\_\_\_\_ to God: it is personally fulfilling.**

v. 2 *It is like the precious oil on the head, running down on the beard, on the beard of Aaron, running down on the collar of his robes!*

B. “Like” dew: **Godly unity is like a \_\_\_\_\_ to society; it is nationally fruitful.**

v. 3a *It is like the dew of Hermon, which falls on the mountains of Zion!*

**III. THE PURPOSE: Godly unity unlocks God’s \_\_\_\_\_ .**

v. 3b *For there the Lord has commanded the blessing, life forevermore.*

**IV. A PATHWAY FORWARD: \_\_\_\_\_ “there”—to Christ’s Person and Work—every day!**

HOME GROUP STUDY

*The city of Jerusalem is situated on a high hill. The Songs of Ascents (Psalms 120-134) were sung by Jews traveling from their homes to Jerusalem on the "ascent," or the uphill road to the city, for one of the three main annual Jewish festivals.*

Read Psalm 133 aloud.

1. How does the world define *blessing*? Does God defines blessing the same way? What insight did the sermon bring you?

2. How can life with others be 'good' and 'pleasant' and yet so difficult at times? Does the presence of difficulty mean unity is absent?

3. How can Christ followers be of different minds, yet united in one heart? In what way have you experienced this yourself, and how did the Holy Spirit work in that situation?

4. Read John 17: 20-26. How is unity the greatest evidence of God's love in us? How does reading Jesus' prayer cause you to look at your own role in the unity of the church?

5. How does God bless and encourage you through time in the company of His people? How do you bless and encourage others yourself?

6. Experiences of unity here on earth are just a small taste of the complete spiritual unity we will enjoy in heaven forever. Spend some time thinking about and discussing what that spiritual unity in heaven might look like, and what you're most looking forward to. How does this help you see relationships with other believers in a different light? Do you need to do anything differently?

*Leave your sermon notes in a prominent place so you can meditate on Psalm 133 over the coming week, adding any additional insights you discover in its verses.*
