A closer look at the Christmas story reveals that ...

I. The real message of the season is best seen in the _____-sheep motif. (v. 8)

- A. Jesus is the Good Shepherd coming to care for His people. (Ps 23)
- B. This baby is the sacrificial Lamb giving Himself for our salvation. (Jn 1:29)

Gift Idea: NOTICE THOSE WHO NEED YOUR CARE AND KINDNESS DURING THIS HOLIDAY TIME.

II. The sign of the holidays isn't tinsel or trees but a _____ spirit in man. (v. 12)

- A. God wants us to notice the wrapping Jesus came in. (Phil 2:8)
- B. The Redeemer demonstrates that one of the greatest virtues of man is humility. (Prov 3:34)

Gift Idea: LOOK FOR A WAY TO DEMONSTRATE HUMILITY TOWARD SOMEONE NEEDING FORGIVENESS.

III. The mystery of the season is that often the greatest _____ are quiet and courteous. (vv. 13-15)

- A. With the announcement of the angels came pomp and circumstance, but the king was quiet. (Matt 21:5)
- B. God stands at our door and knocks courteously. (Rev 3:20)

Gift Idea: REMIND SOMEONE WHO IS HURTING THAT THE QUIET ACT OF PRAYER UNLEASHES THE POWER OF GOD.

IV. The spirit of the season teaches that true value is not found in things but in _____. (vv. 16-18)


- A. The absence of costly things makes it clear that relationships are God's highest priority. (1 Jn 5:11-12)
- B. Eternal life is not a commodity one buys or acquires, but a relationship with the Life-Giver. (Jn 14:6)

Gift Idea: ASK JESUS IF THERE IS A RELATIONSHIP YOU NEED TO STRENGTHEN OR MEND.

DEVOTIONAL LESSON

1. What are some of the small, subtle things about the Christmas season that you treasure the most? What glitzy, over-the-top things are the most distracting to you?

2. When have you received or experienced something precious that came through humble means or in an ordinary way? (It can be a physical item but also a treasured moment with a person, an act of kindness, etc.) How did it impact your life? Why do you think God brings some of the most profound moments in a quiet and subtle way?

3. Read Luke 2:1-20. Think of Luke as an artist who paints with words. His gospel is like an art gallery full of masterpieces, including a picture of God's perfect man—Jesus. Why do you think some would regard the book of Luke as "the most beautiful book ever written"? How did the sermon help you see this passage in a new light?

4. Which of the main points (I., II., etc.) or sub-points (A., B.) of the sermon were a new thought for you? What was most intriguing about that concept?

5. Which of the "GIFT IDEA" applications in the sermon notes was something you felt the Holy Spirit's gentle nudging to focus on? What person comes to mind, and what specific action toward them?

6. Spend some time writing down a list of how in this past year God has quietly ...

- protected you
- worked all things together for good
- moved behind the scenes
- given you salvation
- blessed you

Close in prayer, thanking God for the specific things you listed above. Ask Him to show you the subtle signs of His presence and His searching for you during this time of year.
