HOME GROUP / DEVOTIONAL LESSON

1. How have you seen God working in your life during the last few weeks? If your Home Group is resuming this week, take some time also to catch up with members about how they spent the holidays.

2. Did you measure your spiritual goals in 2016? If so, what was the result? What spiritual goals do you have for 2017? How would you hope your walk with Christ will be different at the end of this year, and what are you putting in place to move toward that goal (e.g., memorizing Scripture, reading through the Bible, attending a Bible class)?

3. How have Christ Chapel's core values impacted you personally over the last year? In what way(s) do you participate in these core values in the life of our church?

4. Dr. D. A. Robbins said: *"Fellowship with the body of Christ is God's great classroom of the development of Christian character. We are benefitted by both the strengths and weaknesses of the fellowship. The mature ones help to strengthen and encourage us, while the weaknesses in the less mature give us the opportunity to practice our spiritual growth. Get involved and stay in faithful fellowship with the body of Christ! Don't run off if something disappoints you or you get your feelings hurt—this only demonstrates immaturity and places you in further danger of losing out with God. If you alienate yourself from fellowship, you will be regressing down a path that leads away from God."* How has this quote applied to you in the past, or even now? What promptings from the Spirit of God are encouraging you to engage in more than just Sunday worship? See Galatians 6:10 and Hebrews 10:24-25 for additional insight.

5. Have you determined personal or family core values since hearing this sermon preached annually? (See box below for one way to go about this.) If not, why not? If you have, how has implementing a core values strategy helped keep your life focused on God?

Close in prayer for our fellowship and leaders. Ask the Holy Spirit to lead you regarding what to pray from our eight core values for the coming year.
