1. Read Nehemiah 1:1-4. Why was this news so upsetting to Nehemiah?
2. What were Nehemiah's first actions after weeping? Why is it so crucial that we follow his example in everything we do?
3. In what ways are Nehemiah's situation and the times he lived in similar to our lives as Christians today? Why does it not really matter where we live or what times we live in, when our citizenship is not of this world (Phil 3:20-21)?
4. Why is our commitment to protecting the lives of the unborn so important in God's economy? Why do we focus on this topic every year, and what does it have to do with building God's kingdom?
5. Explain why our allegiance to Christ must come before any other allegiance we may have. How do we know when an allegiance other than to Christ has taken up first place, and what should we do about it?
6. Do you need to rebuild a commitment to prayer in your life? What specific areas need the most prayer, and how can you refocus on your relationship with God through prayer over the next month, and even beginning right now?
