5. Read Matthew 22:37-40. What did Nehemiah willingly give up in order to be an example of a person who lives by the first two Commandments? How did his sacrificial generosity encourage others, and what did it accomplish in the bigger picture?

6. In what ways have you demanded your own rights above loving your neighbor during the pandemic? What does love require of us in this case? See also Matthew 22:37-40; Romans 14:15-19, Romans 15:1-3 and 1 Corinthians 10:24.
