ILLUSTRATION 1: WHAT JESUS WARNS

Jesus detests religious-looking _____.

And in his teaching he said, "Beware of the scribes, who like to walk around in long robes and like greetings in the marketplaces and have the best seats in the synagogues and the places of honor at feasts, who devour widows' houses and for a pretense make long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation." vv. 38-40

ILLUSTRATION 2: WHAT JESUS WANTS

Jesus desires _____.

*And he sat down opposite the treasury and watched the people putting money into the offering box. Many rich people put in large sums. And a poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which make a penny. And he called his disciples to him and said to them, "Truly, I say to you, this poor widow has put in more than **all** those who are contributing to the offering box. For they **all** contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in **everything** she had, **all** she had to live on." vv. 41-44 (lit: all her life!)*

*"And you shall love the Lord your God with **all** your heart and with **all** your soul and with **all** your mind and with **all** your strength.' The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." Mark 12:30-31*

HOME GROUP & DEVOTIONAL STUDY

1. Describe a time when you were so immersed in something that every part of your life was focused around it. Would you say you are devoted to Jesus with that same intensity?
2. Read Mark 12:38-44. Knowing this is the last public teaching Jesus gave before His crucifixion, what about this passage is particularly striking to you?
3. Every action of the religious leaders was not offered to God so much as offered to *other people*. How have you also fallen into this trap? What warning does Jesus give to those who choose to live this way?
4. Why didn't the widow just give one coin as an offering and keep the other for herself and her needs? What does her action tell you about her attitude toward God?
5. There is often some part of our lives, our activities or our selves that we hold back from submitting to Christ. What are you holding back? How would submission cause your devotion to Him to grow?
6. What points in the sermon were particularly insightful or helpful for you? What has encouraged you to make a change?
