EXERCISE FOR THIS WEEK

According to Pew Research Center, in 2019 only 44 percent of people ages 23-38 were married. Marriage rates are plummeting, and it is predicted that at the current rate about 25 percent of millennials will never be married—an all-time low.

"Marriage may cause some problems while it solves others. It is not intended by God to resolve all personal, emotional, or spiritual difficulties. It definitely intensifies some of them. ... There are troubles unique to singleness, but they may be exceeded by those in marriage." —John MacArthur

Paul makes it clear that spirituality is not determined by relationship status. In light of current trends, Christians should consider what work the Lord may now be doing in the lives of single believers in His Church. A study of single adults in the Bible demonstrates that singleness affords the opportunity to live for the Lord, undistracted by additional responsibilities. They were unconcerned with spouses, education or lucrative careers—rather, their focus was on following the Lord despite the unique costs.
