## II. Jesus comes to satisfy humanity's thirst.

#### 1. Jesus is available.

This man [Nicodemus] came to Jesus by **night** ... John 3:2 And he [Jesus] **had** to pass through Samaria. ... so Jesus, wearied as he was from his journey, was sitting beside the well. It was about **the sixth hour**. John 4:4, 6

#### 2. Jesus makes a direct connection.

... the **light** has come into the world, and people loved the **darkness** rather than the **light** because their works were evil. John 3:19 A woman from Samaria came to **draw water**. Jesus said to her, "Give me a **drink**." John 4:7

#### 3. Jesus knows back-stories.

Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered him,

"Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things?" John 3:9-10

Jesus said to her, "Go, call your husband, and come here." The woman answered him, "I have no husband." Jesus said to her, "You are right in saying, 'I have no husband'; for you have had five husbands, and the one you now have is not your husband. What you have said is true." John 4:16-18

#### 4. Jesus offers Himself.

"For God so loved the world, that **he gave his only Son**, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." John 3:16 The woman said to him, "I know that Messiah is coming (he who is called Christ). When he comes, he will tell us all things." Jesus said to her, "**I who speak to you am he.**" John 4:25-26

6. How can you rely on Jesus in the coming weeks to satisfy your thirst instead of trying to find it elsewhere, especially during this holiday season in a year of turmoil and uncertainty? What specific and purposeful action can you take?
