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Week Seven: "I Am A Man ... Of Respect For Women"

What do you think of women? Wait. Let me rephrase that. What do you think of women that you would want others to know about? You see, the kinds of thoughts we entertain about women say a lot about us. They reveal the condition of our hearts. They display our moral character. While hidden from the view of others, they are in clear view of our God and our own consciences. Maybe your struggle is not with improper or immoral thoughts about women, but simply an attitude that takes them for granted or looks down on them. Who a man is in his relationship with women, or in the company of women, reveals so much about who that man truly is. How do you relate to the women God has placed in your life? How do you approach and regard them? How do you handle and deal with those women, young and old, who have been entrusted to your care or who merely cross your path in the course of daily life? The answers to these questions will go a long way in revealing just what kind of men we truly are.
