GO BACK TO THE BEGINNING

DEVOTIONAL & HOME GROUP STUDY

Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal His truth and wisdom as you go through this lesson.

1. Read Genesis 1:3—2:3 and Job 38:1-7, 42:1-6. God does not explain anything to Job, whose questions are silenced simply by hearing God speak. What do these passages teach us about God's character, and about living with mystery in regard to His actions?

3. How can you seek a new beginning with God and allow Him to order your life after hearing the pastor talk about it (sermon point I)?

4. Read Isaiah 61:1-4 and Romans 8:28. Just as He did in Genesis 1:2, God steps into the chaos and destruction of our life and brings good. Where do you need to trust that He will bring beauty from ashes?

5. In what area do you need to go back to obeying God's Word so that you can see His goodness (sermon point II)?

6. Jesus is Lord of the Sabbath (Matt 12:8, Mk 2:28, Lk 6:5). What does this mean? How will the sermon help you to release and rest in Christ's completed work by faith (point III)?

4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9) "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:

"Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
